

Fifth Sunday after Pentecost



### Reflections from the Rector

Even the early church had a stewardship campaign. Paul might have been the first stewardship chairperson!

It sounds like the Corinthians (this is Paul's second letter to them) are a little tight-fisted. They agreed to support the growing Church in Christ but seem to be reluctant to actually put their money where their mouths were. Paul goes on .... <sup>10</sup> And in this matter I am giving my advice: it is appropriate for you who began last year not only to do something but even to desire to do something— <sup>11</sup> now finish doing it, so that your eagerness may be matched by completing it according to your means." Calling them to fulfill their oral pledges, Paul is stern in his request to the Church in Corinth calls them to follow through on their "eager promises."

They were enthusiastic, it seems, to be part of this venture – the building of Christ's Kingdom on earth. They said they would provide resources – financial and human – to ensure these promises were fulfilled. When push came to shove, however, it seems some are not quite ready to follow through on the commitments they made.

The 21<sup>st</sup> Century Church isn't much different, I'm afraid. We are all anxious for our churches to have enough money, to have adequate clergy presence, to have office staff and musicians and Sunday School teachers and ... you fill in the blanks with your wish list. Our wants go on and on, yet Paul is telling the Corinthians that maybe they have everything they need already.

God gives us what we *need*, not what we *want*. Sometimes wants and needs are the same, but more often than not, our wants far outweigh our needs. Paul is reminding the Church that God provided manna for the Israelites in the wilderness. While they might not have been fond of the menu selection, they had all they needed.

Summer is a good time to reflect on our current blessings, remembering that *everything* we have first belonged to God. We are given time think about our commitments of time, talent and treasure to our faith communities. Have we fulfilled our promises? Is there more we can do as we look ahead to 2022? Our churches – all three of them – require participation in all three areas by everyone. We all have gifts we can give in time, treasure and talent and, as Paul calls the Corinthians to give their all, so we are asked to give more. While the tithe (10%) is often used as the standard measure of giving, even 1% can be significant and life-changing for both the giver *and* the church.

I invite you to join me this summer in discerning how you are supporting your congregation with your time, your gifts of talent, and your financial gifts. Can we do more? Of course, we all can do more. Are we willing to do more? That is the question Paul is asking of the Corinthians.

Not much has changed over the last 2000 years, it seems. It's easy to forget that we are but stewards of God's gifts – of all of them – without exception. We are asked to give back but a fraction of our time (an hour a week?), our talent (answering phones, calling homebound, writing notes, working in the garden) and our treasure (can you increase your giving by 3% in 2022 – not a 3% increase in tithing, but 3% of your current giving?).

God calls us to be more. God wants us to be more. God has given us everything we need to be strong and faithful communities and followers of Jesus. How much are we willing to give to be sure we are answering the call?

Thank you Rebecka Westerbeek for the wonderful cookies!


It looks like we will continue with sack lunches through August.

- Diocesan COVID -19 Update!!!! We have now moved to Phase 3 of the COVID Directive, please find more specifics <a href="here">here</a>. Below are a short, abbreviated version of some of the changes:
  - The revised directives take effect July 1st.
  - Masks are not required after July 1st but are encouraged.
  - o Communion will still be in one substance (bread) only.
  - Avoid crowding and physical sharing of the peace.
  - Fellowship hour may be offered. Food must be served, not put out as a buffet.
  - Social distancing is required through the end of June.
