#### Reflection from the Rector

Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth; for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and the sea was no more. <sup>2</sup>And I saw the holy city, the new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband. <sup>3</sup>And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "See, the home of God is among mortals. He will dwell with them as their God; they will be his peoples, and God himself will be with them; <sup>4</sup>he will wipe every tear from their eyes. Death will be no more; mourning and crying and pain will be no more, for the first things have passed away." <sup>5</sup>And the one who was seated on the throne said, "See, I am making all things new." Also he said, "Write this, for these words are trustworthy and true." <sup>6</sup>Then he said to me, "It is done! I am the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end. To the thirsty I will give water as a gift from the spring of the water of life. Revelation 21:1-6

This passage from John's Revelation is a passage often chosen for the burial rite of a funeral. It describes in succinct detail God's presence among us before, during and after our mortal existence. It is a hope-filled passage and one that provides peace to those who mourn.

John's revelation includes a view of Jerusalem, the new city, the city on the hill that comes out of heaven to be among us on earth. The passage describes a loving God who walks with us in this earthly existence. We do not have to wait until our death to see and experience the God of John's revelation. God's home is with us.

God's mercy is profound – God wipes every tear from the eyes of those who mourn. Death is abolished by God's loving hands ... as is pain and suffering of

human beings. The ways of the world are no more ... God is creating a new world in which we will exist with Jesus and all the saints who have gone before us.

As we observe All Saints' this weekend, let us remember John's dream, a dream of a new heaven and a new earth. May we rest in peace and hope knowing that with God all things are possible, including overcoming pain, crying, suffering and death. God raised Jesus from the dead. The love of God is awesome and amazing. We will cry no more and rest in peace with those who are in the nearer presence of God.
