Reflection from the Rector

Look! He is coming with the clouds; every eye will see him, even those who pierced him; and on his account all the tribes of the earth will wail. So it is to be. Amen. (from Revelation 1:4b – 8)

This week's second reading is from John's Revelation. The above passage is part of the poetry in that passage ... Look!

"Look! ... every eye will see him, even those who pierced him...."

We are told that when Jesus comes again He will come in the clouds and every person on earth will see him. The passage also tells us that those who have denied Him, who do not believe in Him, will see Him. Those who have not believed, though seen, will feel God's wrath.

The visual of Jesus descending from the clouds is an ethereal vision. We are reminded of the Transfiguration when Jesus took Peter, John and James up the mountain. His clothes and His face turned effervescent white. I imagine the Second Coming will have Jesus descending with bright light.

Many of the descriptions of Jesus' coming can be frightening because we don't know what will happen. It is our job to follow Jesus in this life and believe that those who follow Him will be saved from the torment to be leveled against the earth.

Being a follower of Jesus might provide us with some sense of security. Knowing that God loves us and will send God's greatest gift of all time to redeem us is the essence of our faith. It is our faith that grounds us in this world while our hearts, souls and minds exist in another plain. It is our faith that gives us confidence in Jesus' words and God's promises.

"Look! So it is to be. Amen"

Believe that promise of the King returning to claim His kingdom.
