Reflections from the Rector

From the desk of Reverend Diane Pike

The Old Testament reading for this weekend continues the story of David's fall from grace. Uriah (Bathsheba's husband) has been killed in battle, as David had planned. She is mourning the loss of her husband while God is lamenting the fallen relationship with David.

I think the message for most of us in this reading comes in the third paragraph, following an indictment of an unrighteous man in the second paragraph. The prophet, Nathan, interprets God's words to David. Finding him ungrateful and sinful Nathan states, "You are that man!" In the indictment we hear God's words of disappointment about David – "I made you king, I gave you the kingdom of Judah and Israel, and I rescued from Saul. I would have given you anything you asked." God finds Nathan not only sinful, but ungrateful and lacking in remorse; even greedy.

How many of us could make a list of the things God has given us? Our homes, family, work that provides for our physical needs, and gifts of the Spirit to help build the kingdom of God? How many of us have recently thanked God for all we have been given? How many of us have recently asked God for more than we need, for more than we have?

I truly believe the more we have, the more we want, especially with "things." Why is that?

Perhaps, like David, we look not to God to fill the emptiness we are trying to fill but to "stuff" that will never make us happy. Only the love of God can fill our souls and grant us all that we really need, regardless of what we might think we should have.

It's a valuable spiritual exercise to take inventory every so often to remind ourselves of God's abundant gifts and care for each of us. This exercise won't take long ... our blessings overflow even when we are less than mindful of them.

John's gospel is all about signs ... signs of who Jesus is and who God is in relationship with the Son. What are the signs you see in your life that evidence God's abundant love for you and your family? List them alongside all your blessings, and give God thanks.
